- 3. If the wage offered fails to meet the prevailing wage guidelines in accordance with the Department of Labor regulation, it may be necessary to repost this memo with the revised information.
- 4. Send a copy of this posting to OISS along with the other requested information from the H-1B checklist, so OISS can begin the H-1B paperwork.
- 5. At the end of the posting period, remove and return the two posted notices to OISS. These notices will be maintained in the Department of Labor Public Access file.
